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Public Notice Warning Homeowners May Face Penalties For Hiring Unlicensed Contractors!!!

According to Florida Law, consumers who knowingly hire unlicensed construction contractors could face a fine of up to \$5,000.

Chapter 455-228 of the Florida Statutes allows the Florida department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) to impose a civil penalty of \$500 to \$5,000 on individuals who aid and abet unlicensed contractors. They may also be liable for court costs. AID-ING AND ABETTING IS DEFINED BY THE STATUTES AS ANYONE WHO EMPLOYS AN UNLICENSED CONTRACTOR OR COMPANY. "CONSUMERS WHO HIRE SUCH A CONTRACTOR FACE NOT ONLY VICTIMIZATION BY SHODDY WORKMANSHIP, NO FOLLOW-UP SERVICE, AND INFERIOR PRODUCTS; THEY FACE POTENTIAL DIFFICULTIES WITH THE LAW."

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From the Desk of the Public Relations Trustees

Welcome back to our Snowbirds. It is great to see the activity pick up in the park. We have seen a lot of new people so far this year. Let's make them feel welcome to our beautiful park and help them out when we can.

Now that you are back, you need to make sure your trailers and lots are put in good shape. Is there mold/mildew on your trailer, out buildings or awnings? Do you have vegetation that needs to be taken care of? Are there other projects that need done? Doing these things makes our Park look great. With the break from the heat, more people are out taking care of their trailers. Don't forget that if you make any changes on the outside of your trailer, you need to turn in a PP33 to the ARC committee for approval.

We have a Violation Monitoring Software that has simplified our reporting and notifications of items that need to be taken care of. We ride around the park periodically with our Park Manager, Lee Morris, to check out the following items:

- Building Repairs Required
- · Tall grass, weeds, or unsightly vegetation
- · Mold, dirt, and/or Algae on building or fences
- · Trim trees, bushes and/or shrubs
- · Grass, Weeds, Vegetation in Gravel/Pavers
- · Junk or Clutter on Property
- · Proper ARC or County Building Permits
- Overnight parking per Rules and Regulations Part D
- · Improper parking of a boat, boat trailer, travel trailer, motor home or similar item. Deed restriction #6.

If violations are reported, the property owner will receive a violation letter. After the third violation a fine could be levied.

Complaint Process

You can help the PR trustees by letting us know of a problem. We try to catch everything, but we can miss some things. You can file a complaint using PP32. Turn the form in at the office. One of us will check out the complaint as soon as possible and respond to you with our disposition of the claim. We may not be able to come up with a resolution, but we can try to direct you to someone who can help you.

Operation of a Golf Cart - Update

Effective October 1, 2023 CS/CS/HB 949 (Chapter 2023-67,L.O.F.) requires that a person operating a golf cart on a public road or street, as authorized by the responsible local government entity, must

- If 18 years of age or older, possess a form of government-issued Photographic identification; or
- If under 18 years of age, possess a valid learner's driver license or valid driver license.

County Regulation on House Numbers

House numbers must be at least 4 inches high and visible from the street. This is so Emergency Vehicles can find a location easily.

New Estoppel Program for Trailer Estates PP-27C

Estoppel Program Cost to Process: \$100 per Estoppel (Payable to Trailer Estates)

Any person who Sells/Purchases/Makes a Title Transfer of Property within Trailer Estates Park & Recreation District must submit an Estoppel Request to the main office. This is done by the Title Company or Attorney who is handling the closing. Private sales or Transfer of Title (Quit Claim) must still submit the estoppel request even if not using a title company or Attorney.

In addition, a written application from each prospective purchaser must be submitted and approved BEFORE the sale or transfer. 12. In order to maintain a community of congenial residents who are agreeable to abide by the "housing for older persons" restrictions contained in the Deed Restrictions and provisions of the Charter of Trailer Estates Park and Recreation District (hereinafter collectively "Restrictions"), the transfer of lots or parcels by any owner shall be subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth as long as said Restrictions shall remain in force and effect: It shall be necessary for the Board of Trustees of the Trailer Estates Park and Recreation District, or its duly authorized officers, agents or committee, to approve in writing all sales, transfer of title, leases or subleases of a lot or parcel, or occupation of a dwelling unit on a lot or parcel, before such sale, transfer, lease, sublease or occupation shall be valid and effective. Written application for such approval shall contain such information as may be reasonably required by application forms promulgated by the board of Trustees and shall be accompanied by a transfer fee as required by resolution of the Board, provided, however, such fee shall not exceed Fifty

Trailer Estates will perform the following actions:

- Advise any Fines or Service Fees charged to Property by Trailer Estates.
- 2. Advise any outstanding Violations.

(\$50.00) Dollars.

- 3. Require appropriate Application(s) to be filled out and completed, along with Application Fee to Live/Own/Rent Property in Trailer Estates prior to closing.
- 4. Age Verification & ID check (copy of Driver's License or State ID, Birth Certificate, ETC.
- 5. We will Disclose the Annual Assessment Cost + Any Special Assessment(s) that are in place.
- 6. Advise that Trailer Estates Is not a Pet Friendly Community (except 46 Specific Homes).

If the Estoppel process is not followed by anyone who Sells/Purchases/Makes a Title Transfer of Property within Trailer Estates Park & Recreation District, they may be subject to Fines & Suspensions under Part E of the Rules & Regulations.

Architectural Review Committee DON'T START A PROJECT ON YOUR HOME WITHOUT AN ARC REVIEW

If you make any changes to the outside of your home, you must first obtain an ARC APPROVAL prior to beginning work. This is for repairs and/or new work. Changes or additions to your mobile home includes but not limited to doors, windows, stairs, pavers, A/C, sheds, etc. The office can provide you with a blank Approval Form (PP33) or you may find it on the Trailer Estates website. The Architectural Review Committee (ARC) will review your completed application and approve or deny your request. The ARC will notify you upon the approval/denial.

Upon approval, an orange card will be issued and must be displayed in your window for 6 (SIX) months or completion of project, whichever comes first. Lot Surveys MAY BE REQUIRED. All permits will expire 6 (SIX) months from date of issue. The ARC has up to 30 (THIRTY) days to ACT on your request. Thank you for your help with this matter.

Basic Marina Information

The marina is very limited on longer size slips. If you are going to buy a boat that is over 19 feet long, **please**, call the dock master to see if we have a slip available. The Dock master has had to disappoint several people by telling them we had no place for them to dock their new boat.

Boats will only be rented slips that they fit in. For instance, if you have a boat that fits in a 28 foot slip, you will not be able to rent a 30 ft slip, if your boat fits in a 22ft slip, you will not able to rent a 26ftslip. The larger slips are for longer boats. Boats are measured from the farthest thing that sticks out on the bow to the motor in full tilt. We do not measure your boat by what it says on the registration.

If you are buying a party boat, deck boat or pontoon boat, please watch the size of the beam (width) of the boat you buy. These newer, wider boats have a hard time fitting in many of the slips without touching the sides of the decking. Please buy a boat that will give you room, on each side, to adjust with the ebb and flow of the tide.





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Recycle Information

We are having trouble with the wrong items being placed in the recycle container. Only these items are accepted: newspaper, soft cover books, cardboard, **glass bottles** (only glass accepted), aluminum cans, tin cans, plastic (with the triangle symbol on the bottom of them). Please put all other items in the solid waste dumpster. Never place items above the rim of the dumpster nor on the ground around the dumpster. Violators may be charged the cost to have the maintenance department correct the program.

MORE RECYCLE NEWS:

Motor oils can be recycled at Auto Zone, and other retail automotive stores. Batteries can be recycled at Batteries Plus. Propane tanks can be recycled at Detweilers, there is no charge. **DO NOT PUT THESE ITEMS IN DUMPSTERS!**

YARD WASTE INFORMATION:

Only brush, trees and grass (no sod) may be put in the yard waste dumpster. All other material goes in solid waste dumpster.

SOLID WASTE INFORMATION:

Solid waste dumpster is for general trash and debris. **NO FLAM-ABLES, OILS, BATTERIES, CHEMICALS OR PROPANE TANKS AL-LOWED**. These items can be recycled quarterly at Manatee County recycle locations at no charge. Watch your water bill for times and locations. **TV, AIRCONDITIONERS, LARGE APPLIANCES**, please call Waste Pro at 941-355-9600 for pick up.

PLEASE BREAK DOWN YOUR BOXES, UNBROKEN BOXES TAKE UP SPACE AND COST THE PARK MONEY.

DEPOSITS: If the records custodian determines that the request will require extensive clerical work to compile the requested records, extensive supervisory assistance, or an extensive use of information technology resources, an advance deposit may be required before the request will be processed.

ADDITIONAL FEE INFORMATION:

Public record requests requiring extensive clerical or supervisory assistance, extensive research (i.e. legal, paralegal, etc.), or extensive use of information technology resources may be charged an additional fee on a case by case basis.

The fee shall be based on the cost incurred for such extensive use of information technology resources or the labor cost of the personnel providing the service that is actually incurred by the Trailer Estates Park and Recreation District(TE) or attributable to TE for the clerical and supervisory assistance required, or both. Labor costs will include wages, Medicare/social security employer costs, and costs of benefits (health, dental, and retirement).

An additional fee may be charged for requests which require an extensive amount of clerical or supervisory assistance (more than 15 minutes), or an extensive use of information technology.

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Meet Your Neighbor

Gustaf Verheul was born in Amsterdam, Netherlands on March 12, 1931.

At the age of four, Gustav was sent to live for a year with his grandparents in Germany. His grandfather had been a German military officer and was the mayor of Kiel-Pries. Under his grandfather's instruction, Gustaf learned to speak German, garden, and world geography.

He returned to Netherlands on a train, by himself, at the age of five. Neutrality was not possible during World War II, and the 88-hour war with Germany in 1940 brought Netherlands under a five-year occupation.

Gustav was rescued by the Salvation Army where he went to church and discovered a love for music. On his 10th birthday, he and his six-year-old sister were on their own to get across war-torn areas to neutral Switzerland. Upon arrival in Bern, Gustaf walked to the YMCA hostel. After a few days there, he was off by foot and crossed the Austrian border. He was rescued by a nun who brought him to a manse which housed 40 boys who could speak 80 languages. After three months, he was again off by foot and met a German officer who offered him a ride to Treblinka, Poland. He was able to leave there by bicycle and headed west. At a military post near Prague, Czechoslovakia, he did cleaning work for food. Gustav traveled to Metz, France to work in a circus before getting back to Amsterdam. A German soldier gave him coins to get food and drinks along the way. Following the end of the war, Gustaf's uncle in Michigan sent a letter enclosed with money for food, clothing, and tickets to America for the whole Verhuel family.

The family secured visas and passports and was added to the immigration list. After a two-year wait, they were informed that in July 1947 their request to immigrate to America would be granted. Gustaf and his sister registered for school in Port Huron, Michigan. They were rapidly promoted to be in classes with their peers of the same age.

As a teen, Gustaf came to Sarasota to help a construction man build houses in the summer months. He was paid 50 cents per hour and given \$5 per week spending money and charged an unannounced fee for board and room.

A draft notice came for him in the mail. He would be a soldier in Korea. Offloading in Inchon, Korea in a snowstorm, there were no lights allowed, not even a cigarette lighting. The unit marched all night and was thrown into a major assault. Twelve men were killed including the squad leader. Gustaf was to replace him. He said, "As a boy in Europe it was survival. In Korea, it was kill or get killed." He was wounded in both wars. In Korea he was evacuated by helicopter with a concussion and taken to a M.A.S.H. unit.

The military flew him back to Florida where he went to evening classes at Sarasota High School to get his GED. He passed the citizenship test and was sworn into citizenship in Tampa.

With a GED in hand, he entered college at St. Petersburg Junior College with a major in music. Graduating with an associate degree, he started teaching German and Algebra at Sarasota High School. He became an assistant football coach for 12 years.

Gustaf was awarded a Fulbright Scholarship and spent the summers studying in Germany and Austria. He received his Master's and Ph.D. from Florida State University. He retired after 30 years of teaching from Sarasota High School.

Gustaf loves dancing, singing, and traveling. He has traveled and camped at over 200 National and State Parks.

He moved to a fixer-upper in Trailer Estates. He stays very active in social groups, including frequent ballroom dancing, playing golf, daily swimming, potluck dinners, Saturday park breakfasts, periodic stage shows, and holiday parties. He is a member of the park church and is a frequent soloist.

At the age of 92, this brilliant man continues to share his talents and incredible life with others.
